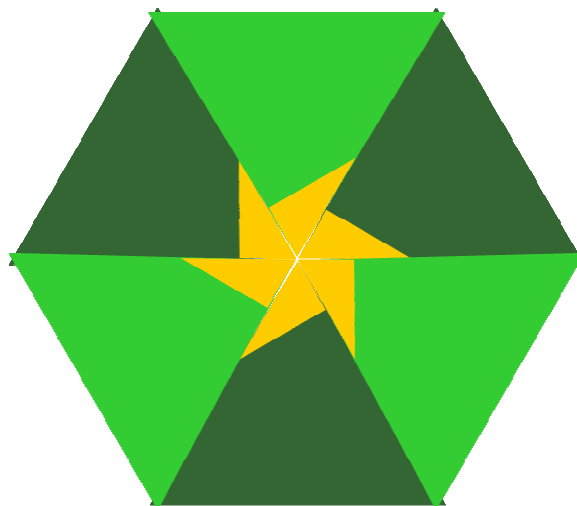
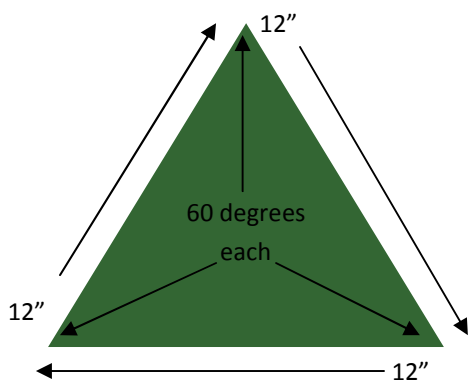
**FABRIC:**

- **Green: (6) 12" x 12" scraps OR (2) 12" strips of two different greens**
- **Gold: 5" strip**
- **Binding: (2) 2 1/4" strips**
- **Backing: 3/4 yd**

## 9th Tree Table Topper

**CUT TRIANGLES:**

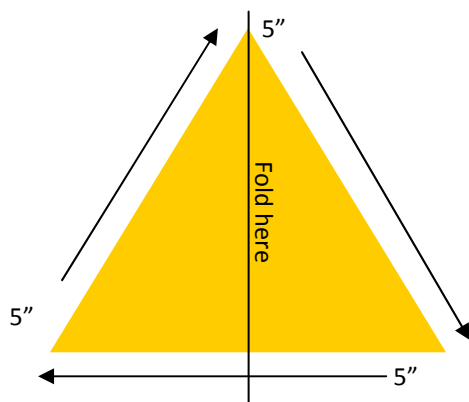
Cut (6) 12" x 12" x 12" equilateral triangles from different greens, or (3) from one green and (3) from another.



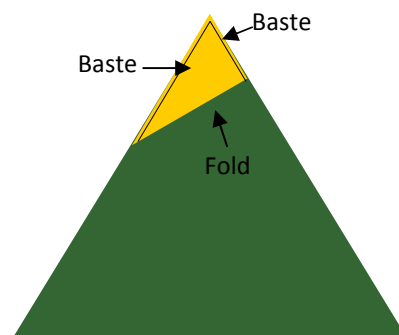
*If desired, cut a whole in the center and use as a Christmas tree skirt for a pencil tree.*

You can do this using an equilateral ruler, such as the Kaye Wood's "Starmaker 6" by EZ International, or you can use the 60 degree line on any ruler.

Cut (5) 5" equilateral triangles from gold. Fold each right sides together and press.

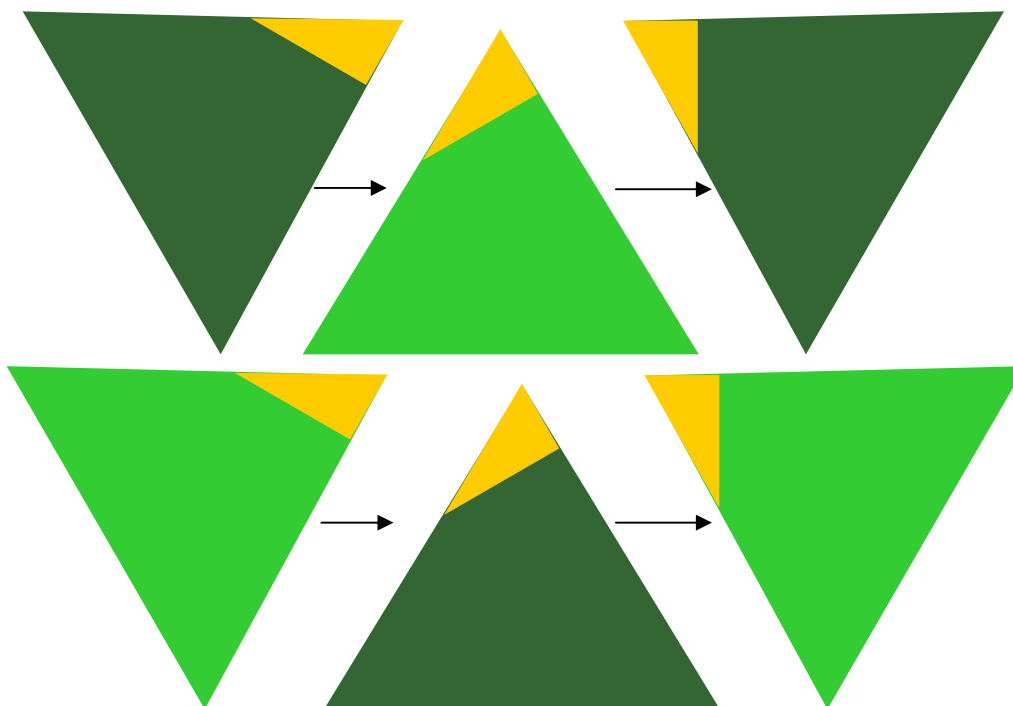


Align a folded gold piece on each green piece as shown. The raw edges of the gold will line up with the edges of the green. Baste in place close to raw edges using large stitch.

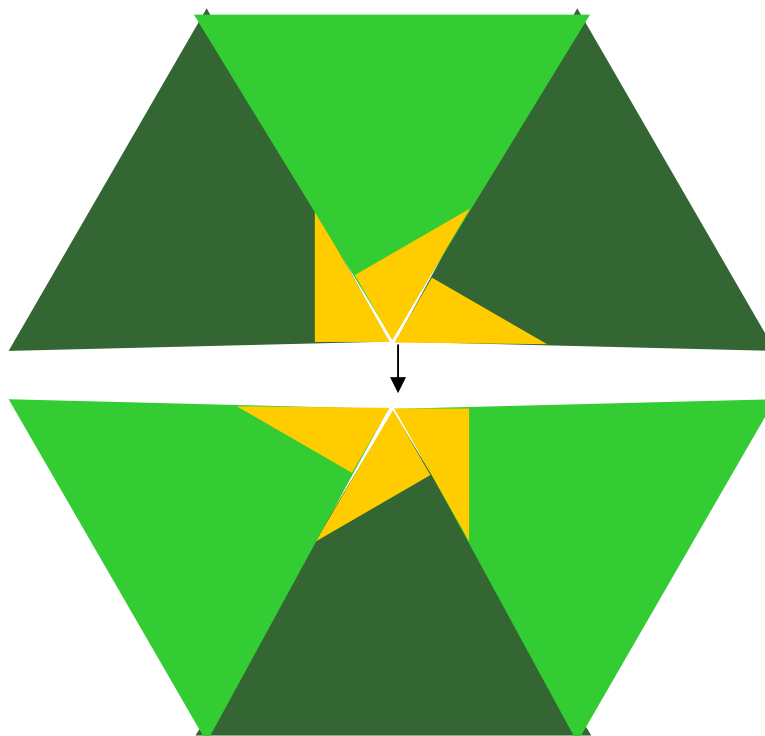


# Assemble the Table Topper

Using a quarter inch seam and normal stitch length, sew three triangles together, varying colors to form two rows as shown.



Press one row toward outside triangles and the other toward inside triangles. Stitch rows together as shown.



Layer, quilt and bind.
